MESSAGE FROM EAC BOARD CHAIR:

Completing my first year as Chair of the Ethnic Arts Council of Los Angeles has been a real pleasure. Our Board members have been extremely active during the year providing well-received programming and events for our members, staying in touch with what is going on in the world of Tribal Art and conveying that information through the e-News and e-blasts. Additionally, the Board has grown the EAC membership to an all time high.

This year's EAC annual dinner at the Fowler Museum was well attended with over 125 guests. The annual dinner and silent auction is our main fundraiser for the year. With this income we are able to generate the funds needed to make our generous museum grants for tribal and ethnographic art related programming. Our total revenue from the EAC dinner after expenses was approximately \$40,000.00. This amount includes the revenue from the dinner and auction as well as the generous gifts to the Virginia Fields Scholarship Fund, which was matched by an anonymous family foundation.

Heading towards the 50th anniversary of the EAC, the Board will take on the task of reassessing the goals and purpose of our organization. The world is changing faster and faster every year as instantaneous communication and the everincreasing reach of the Internet is bringing the most distant tribal cultures into the modern world. The days of the intrepid traveler collecting tribal art in the far reaches of the world is coming to an end. The focus today is towards trying to maintain cultural traditions and not letting them get lost to the modern era. Tribal and cultural art in museums and private collections can also be used as a basis for reminding us all of the cultural past of our forbearers. The EAC Board will explore these topics as we try to find the correct fit for the EAC in an ever changing world, that will led the us into the next 50 years.


