Join us for an unique exhibition of world renowned photographer Sebastiao Salgado. Selections from his recent monumental book on Africa and from his Genesis series, a new project focused on the "pristine," the yet unspoiled world of land-scape, flora, fauna, and human communities will be on view.

Sebastiao Salgado is a documentary photographer with a Ph.D. in economics. He has spent much of the last 30 years in the underbelly of globalization, bearing witness to some of the bleakest chapters of recent history. He has photographed the victims of famine in Ethiopia, genocide in Rwanda, land mines in Angola, ethnic cleansing in the Balkans and war in Afghanistan. His last two major projects, **Workers** and **Migration**, are epic studies of post-industrial economic development, as reflected in the faces of those whom it least serves, from Brazilian gold miners to Vietnamese fishermen, displaced Ecuadorian farmers to Sudanese refugees.

Peter Fetterman, gallery owner and close friend of the Salgados, will do a walk-thru and answer any questions. Signed books are available. Limited to 25 persons.
