

US Film Premier • Wish You Were Here - A Postcard Journey Through Guatemala

The 40 minute film gives the perspective of foreign travelers in Guatemala during the early part of the 20th century. Using 500 original postcards - some hand drawn to hand-tinted art landscapes and/or personal portraits - serve as both a backdrop and story line and includes tourist high points such as Lake Atitlan and Chichicastenango. The indigenous peoples, over 50% of the population, are documented as well as the earthquakes of 1917-18 and the rise and fall of Manuel Cabrera, a dictator who ruled Guatemala from 1898 to1920. Photographers acted as photojournalists and produced postcards which reflected all aspects of Guatemala. Thirty-five different pieces of music - all produced in Guatemala - complement the postcard's images ranging from music of the indigenous people played on flute and drum to 17thcentury cathedral compositions performed by a full orchestra. Mike Glad, a passionate collector, accomplished photographer, and Oscar-nominated filmmaker premiered the film at the Art Deco National Palace of Culture in Guatemala City and received a four-minute standing ovation.
